An Update from the Current Sig Taus

This has been a very productive year so far for the Blue. Between last spring and this fall, we've pledged 8 new brothers and increased our Ranks to 23 active brothers. Our fall pledge class of 3 recently crossed 2 weeks ago.

In an Excellence Assessment conducted by the college of all Greek Organizations, we placed 3rd for fraternities. The Excellence Assessment takes into account a variety of facets of the fraternity, including our reputation, our chapter housing, our activities, and our alumni relations.



We have made improvements to our philanthropy work as well. As we always have, we intend on helping out the Geneseo Boy Scouts with their toy tractor auction. We are also discussing other philanthropy possibilities, including hosting a co-sponsored charity event with Clio called "Phi Kappa Pi a Sig Tau" in which people would pay a nominal fee to pie one of the brothers, with the money going to benefit the American Cancer Society. That event will be planned for the spring when the weather gets warmer. We have also considered using our semesterly grant money available to us through the Inter-Greek Council to purchase snow shovels to help out the residents of Geneseo in times of severe snowfall, and will vote on it in an upcoming fraternity meeting.

Each brother has been improving the campus in his own individual way, in addition to the benefits the fraternity brings as a whole to the campus. We currently have several brothers in executive board positions in various clubs on campus, including, but not limited to: Zach Rapaport and James Flynn as Inter-Fraternity Council President, James Flynn as Junior Class Representative of the Accounting Society, and Kevin Marek as Vice President and Steve Barth as Treasurer of APICS (Business Operations Club). Several of our brothers also regularly make Dean's list, and several belong to the college's Honor Society. One of our brothers, Brent Singleton, has successfully gone through the process of bringing a club to the campus; the Geneseo Film Society will be recognized in Spring 2011.



Our Intramurals are still among some of the best on campus. Last Spring we went 6-1 in coed indoor soccer, making it to the semifinals, as well as 4-3 in men's softball. This fall we went 4-2 in football and 2-2 in coed soccer. We have plans to compete in indoor volleyball in the coming weeks.

As far as our housing goes, we're very proud to inform the alumni that we've renovated our rented home at 27 Orchard. Complete with new flooring, new kitchen appliances, new cabinetry and plumbing, as well as a new downstairs bathroom, our house has become much more livable. One of our active brothers, Evan Marchand, enlisted the help of his father, Marcel Marchand, in much of the kitchen renovation, and we thank him for that. We are discussing bestowing upon him the honor of becoming an honorary brother for the help he has given to the fraternity.

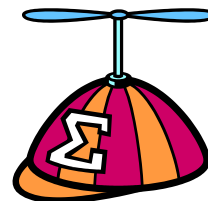
My nickname is "Paco" which means Frank in Spanish. I am in fact half Spanish since my mother's family was from Barcelona, Spain and moved to The Dominican Republic around 1915 for work, my grandfather "Chi Chi" (Spanish people **all** have nicknames) being a singer in a band. My mother was born in the Dominican and the family relocated again to NYC when she was 2 years old. Angelo "Cha Cha" Ventresca, my Sig Tau big brother, started calling me "Paco" around the time I pledged the fraternity, and it stuck. Oila! End of story.....**(Frank "Paco" Maier P'69 G'71)**

My nickname in Sig Tau was "Clean". As freshman Tom Mooney and I lived in the same suite in Genesee Hall. During the first few days I showered daily and I guess that was more than was appropriate and Mooney started calling me "Clean". The name stuck and I was known as "Clean" for all time at Geneseo. One day, during my freshman year, I was walking across the quad with Bob Doucette, whose nickname was the "Deuce. "Along came John Donovan, who was an R.A. in Blake Hall, our dorm. John greeted the "deuce" and then said to me "if he's the Deuce, you must be the Ace "I recall that one pledge class had to discover the answer to a question submitted by each of the brothers. My question was "Who is the only brother that does not call me "Ace?" So, Old Guard, who was it?

Actually I had two nicknames from Sig Tau while at Geneseo, 'Weegs' and 'Jethro'. Weegs was just the first syllable of my last name and interestingly my Brother and my daughters share this nickname, none of us originated it for ourselves, it has always come on us through our friends or acquaintances. Al Shirtluff named me 'Jethro', presumably in homage to the Beverly Hill-Billys character Jethro Bodine, who he thought I was like and how true is that right Shirts? ...**(Tom "Weegs" Wega P'69 G'71)**

I recall as pledges we were presented the task to learn and recite the Greek Alphabet. This was easy for me as I was raised in a bilingual household: English and Greek. For a few early years we (brother, sister and I) attended Greek School @ St Sophia's as the goal was to continue our culture and heritage. (Poor mom: I married a wasp with the name of Nottingham who traces her line back to the Mayflower on both sides) The alphabet was easy to recite, having been drilled into my memory at an early age. I rattled it off including proper inflection and perhaps with a bit of Greek "accent". I guess having the last name of Geatrakas, spouting the Greek alphabet and receiving monthly care packages from home with Baklava and other treats made my nickname "The Greek" pretty easy to stick....**(Chris "The Greek" Gaetrakas P'69 G'70)**

Old Guard, My Sig Tau story started back at Nassau Dorm my freshman year circa August 1968 ! I was placed in a suite with Juniors...Dave Sperino and Don Durbin being notable bros of Sig Tau and floor mates including Bruce Lomnicki and future pledges Lou Zigler and Bill Palmer to name a few! As September unfolded my high school football addiction led me to playing on an independent intramural team with Louie Z., Bill P., Steve Lemke, Ron Kruger, and Jimmy Heffron....the core of the '69 Rush class ! Fraternities didn't mean a lot to me then given my family upbringing or lack thereof; however team membership did ! As the season ran by our team was undefeated and the show down with the Phig 2 team drew some attention in the dorm as well as from the campus Fraternities! Meeting new people every day with similar interests was fun and a diversion from the academic demands of the classroom. So much was happening in my world and "the" world was just beginning to make some sense...Winning that game sealed the deal for my team mates....Blue and white jackets with the strange letters awaiting the ceremonial indoctrination to Greekdom ! Too bad the GDI'S literally ended our youthful yet unlikely trip to the Bigs.....no matter. Sig Tau had ambition to make this pledge class a football draft to be remembered. I never rushed that year though I wanted to continue on with my new friends. I needed more time to take control of my learning as the dean of academics so aptly put it. Fortunately for me, those guys never got too cool once inducted nor did their idiosyncratic ways become mired in group speak to stay sincere and sociable. I didn't feel alone anymore and I learned that despite where we came from, we are now Geneseo students and proud of whom we were becoming. The Sig Tau image was most acceptable for me at that time....and even now . Mickey Brenno is my Big Brother and nicknamed me "Squirrel"! He introduced me to my first wife one evening while killing some time at the Rathskeller ! Knowing Mickey, his intentions; though ignoble, turned out to be what I needed at the time! I returned the favor turning the Perv and his roommate, Tony S. onto some well laced stalks and seeds. That experience still brings tears of joy to my eyes. Watching the range of emotion and the awareness that those two crackles dialogued as they lost control of the situation and the relentless disbelief that they had gotten off on bad shit was comparable to the "BROWN ACID" scare at Woodstock! Looking inward and few signs on the trail....their boyish paranoia was truly social justice awakening! I REASSURED them that the trip would be short lived and to remain in close proximity to feel safe and talk their way out or down as they saw fit ! Some of that cold winter air was just what we needed to take the edge off our buzz on our way to the student Union. Well now....could this have really happened.....yes or know....sounds familiar maybe? There were two occasions, during the winters of '70-'71 and '71-'72, when winter storms closed down the campus as professors, staff, etc. were unable to travel the roads. As soon as it was announced that classes were cancelled, there was a mad rush of students to the Rathskellar, the Idle Hour, Radesi's Hotel, the Vital Spot and The Palace. In '70-'71, the announcement may have been on a Wednesday evening and the rumor was that the village hangouts and campus bar were pretty much out of beer. 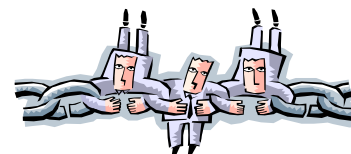
