A Thanksgiving Memory By Bruce Jordan, Cofounder '63

I'm writing this the day before Thanksgiving, knowing that tomorrow will be not just a day of celebration across the country, but also the anniversary of the "coming out" of Sig Tau as well as the assassination of JFK. I thought maybe some of the younger brothers might like a little peek into that fateful day forty nine years ago.

The fall of 1963 had been incredibly beautiful. In memory it seemed like one long Indian summer. Warm and lovely. And we were wildly anticipating the kickoff to the Sig Tau-AD weekend. This was the culmination of months of secret plotting to create a new fraternity on campus. The people I remember most vividly in that undertaking were Tom DeBello, Jack Sheehan, Dahnny Walrath, Jim Vidocy, Ray ("Spike") Leonard, Ralph Harris, Bill Ryan and me. Yes, there were others, but those are the ones that I remember sweating out all those clandestine meetings pretending that we were the Interfaith Council. If anyone thinks it

was an easy undertaking, IT WAS NOT!! The other three fraternities (Prometheus, DK and Phi Sig) did not want this newcomer to happen. It was going to limit their pledge classes at a school that was still 4-1 women to men. So they closed ranks at the Interfraternity Council to try to quash this newcomer. It was the sororities that really helped us come to life.

Friday, November 22, 1963 started with a breakfast in the Mary Jamieson dining hall where we wore our fraternity jackets for the first time. We had breakfast with the AD's and hung out as long as we could before we went to our first classes. We all hooked up again at the college center around lunchtime, proud as peacocks for the usual round of card games and b.s. sessions before going to our one o'clock. The College Center was mission control for all things social in campus life. Each fraternity and sorority had their own informal "area". And now Sig Tau had a spot of its own. And then came the news. On the console tv in the lounge....President Kennedy had been shot. No report of the extent of the injuries, but all of us dropped our hands of euchre or bridge and gathered around the TV. A half hour later, Walter Cronkite removed his dark-rimmed glasses and announced that the president had died. For all of us of a certain age where you were when Kennedy was shot is a clear life's moment.

Later that afternoon Dr. Kathryn Beck spoke to the entire enrollment in Wads Aud explaining how the government would continue to function. And how the college would close five days early for the Thanksgiving break, to which Howie Mathias, a rather uncouth Phi Sig shouted "YAY!!" much to the consternation of those around him. For the next four or five days we were all glued to the television if we were anywhere near one. Tom DeBello and I decided to go to the funeral. At that time it was suspected that the ceremony would be in Boston, so we hitch hiked across New York State to Lee, Massachusetts to spend the

night at my aunt and uncle's place in the Berkshires. Our new Sig Tau jackets were the perfect traveling gear.

The next day we discovered that the funeral would be in Washington instead of Boston and I think by then we had hitched one ride too many and decided to go back to NYC on the bus. My aunt and uncle drove us to the bus station that left from the Rexall Drug Store in Lee, but the bus JUST pulled out when we arrived there. The schedule had changed. But somehow we met a lovely middle aged black couple who were driving to New York and they asked us if we would like to drive with them.

So we drove through the night with this lovely couple, for whom President Kennedy's death must have seemed even MORE disastrous and the four of us listened to the dirge-like music that played on all radio stations all night long.

All in all it was an unforgettable holiday, and a perfect example in life of how something joyous can turn to disaster. I'm sure many other Sig Tau brothers wore their new jackets that weekend, but instead of at a keg with AD, probably at a memorial service for the President.

Bands of Our Era John Hopf, '69

It all began during my junior year at Geneseo. I was living in a Genesee Dorm and had recently been replaced by a piano player in Gordy Ames's DK band Last Sunday's Dreamers LSD haha! I had met Peter Massari when I sold him an old math book. One day he approached me with the idea of starting a band. He had played violin as a youngster and thought he could play bass. His friend Frank "Paco" Maier was a singer. We started rehearsals and eventually Al "Shurts" Shurtleff became our lead quitarist. Shurts could play. We actually were able to secure some gigs.

Our first band name was "Froggy and the Magic Twangers." We were playing in Avon and as usual my guitar would not stay in tune. As a matter of fact we did not sound very good. If I remember correctly Al walked out during the gig. Peter took over as lead quitar, Paco kept singing and I played rhythm. We found a bass player named Don Mente and Larry Pulliafico played drums.

During my senior year Paco was busy with with things so I took over as lead singer and we added Mike Kohlhas on rhythm guitar. Soon after Joe "Crazy Joe' Mantione became our bass player. Joe was talented and very cool, sunglasses and all. Peter had developed into guite a lead player. We played the Jenny Awards, dances and lots of keg parties. Our good friend and brother Carol "CW Moss" used to

scream, "You are the greatest." We were far from great but when we played people would "dance like hell."

Because our performances were "inconsistent" at best, we changed our name often. Our first name was S.A.M. Savage Animal Magnetism. Soon after that we became Hot Snot and Boogie Rags which eventually became Jack Hopf and the Union Clap. Eventually, my little brother Jack "Crazy Jack" May came up with The Budapest String Ensemble.



Hey guys please forgive me for any errors in this article 'cause it was a long time ago. In the spring of 1971 we played a Sig Tau/sorority gig at the Brick in Mt. Morris and at the gig I introduced one of the first

songs I ever wrote called "Window Shattered Time. Because of the efforts of Chuck Curatalo and Peter Massari, we haven't "shattered" time. We have been able to get together and laugh at all our "times" together. Hope to see you all in July.

Bruce Parmiter '69...... Some memories of Sig Tau years, which tie in with the article about the Big tree Inn in the latest issue of the "Geneseo Scene". Prompt Action
Saves Big Tree
From Fire

Fire in a third floor bathroom of the Big Tree Inn could have been disastrous if it hadn't been for the alertness of two college students.

Shortly after midnight Friday morning, April 5, students John Zeh and Bruce Parmiter saw smoke coming from a third floor window of the 135 year old landmark. Manager Peter Pizzuetelli said he saw the two boys running across the street looking up toward the top of the building and he knew that something must be wrong. He met them at the door, and on hearing they saw smoke, he ran upstairs followed by the two students and the bartender Philip Cowie of Perry.

At the top of the stairs on the third floor, they were greeted by a fire raging up one wall of the bathroom. No time to sound the alarm, the four set to work on the blaze with available extinguishers.

Using his bare fists, Cowie, who is also a member of the Perry Fire Department smashed through the wall to get at the fire.

"The heat was so intense I had to lie on the floor," Cowie said.


When the fire had been subdued to the point he could leave, Manager Pizzutelli phoned for the fire department. He told Sheriff's Deskman Fran Lowell that the fire was out, but that he wished fire officials to inspect. Investigation conducted by Chief Deragon and Police Chief William Roodenburg revealed that someone had used the bathroom on the normally unoccupied third floor, and apparently dropped a cigarette on the floor. "We're lucky," said Deragon, 'With a thirty-mile wind like was blowing that night, if the fire hadn't been discovered when It was, it would have been a different story."
